

YOUR STUDY PROGRAMME

Your course will combine:

- Your main qualification.
- Maths and English if you haven't achieved GCSE grade 4 or higher.
- Work experience. related to your course.

You will be assigned a personal tutor, who will monitor your progress and provide guidance for developing your skills in tutorial sessions.

Depending on your chosen subject, a typical college day starts at 8.45am and ends at 4.30pm.

You're not usually required to attend campus 5 days per week, although a certain amount of self-study time is expected to support your learning.

LIFE OUTSIDE THE CLASSROOM

Our wider support and enrichment programme provides everyone with the opportunity to develop new skills and mix with students outside of their study programme.

You can become a digital volunteer as part of our Dx Programme, to support other students improve their digital skills, take part in the Duke of Edinburgh Award or our RCN Prince of Wales Nursing Cadet Scheme to build skills and enhance your CV, whilst supporting our college community.

Our clubs and societies are student driven and have included Lego Club, Sustainability Society, Pokémon Club, Debating Society, local history society and Rainbow Alliance, our LGBTQIAgroup. Our sports academy is also open to everyone.

Our equine students can accumulate 'yard points' by going above and beyond, having excellent attendance or demonstrating good work. Example rewards that points can be spent on are private riding lessons or riding a college horse in external competitions.

We also have a number of events and activities that you can get involved with, such as Sustainability Week, Cultural Awareness days, plus our annual college Pride Week, all of which celebrate and support our diverse college community.

OUR ENVIRONMENT

'Sustainability and Environment' is one of the five areas of our tutorial programme, as protecting the environment is vital to all our futures! Our campuses are dedicated to conservation, with 'no mow' and tree planting zones encouraging flora and fauna. At our Cambridge campus, this extends to a re-wilding project to plant over 400 trees, shrubs and hedgerows, as well as working to The British Hedgehog Preservation Society's actions to nurture hedgehog activity on campus. Our student **Environment Ambassadors have** organised campaigns to improve recycling on campus and recycle soft plastics such as crisp packets.

A vocational course is for you if you prefer a handson approach and enjoy a mixture of theory and practical work. You can go on to further your study at university, a higher apprenticeship or start your career.

What do I need?

- Entry level courses: mostly grade 1 at GCSE
- Level 1 courses: mostly grade 2/3 at GCSE
- Level 2 courses: four or more GCSEs at grade 3 or above
- Level 3 courses: five or more GCSEs at grade 4 or above, including English and Maths

Note: Dog Grooming requires you to successfully complete Level 2 before progressing to Level 3

T-levels are designed by employers to give you qualifications and skills to prepare for employment. They are career-focused, with 80% of your time in the classroom and the other 20% on a relevant industry placement, getting real on-the-job experience.

Move into a skilled occupation or further study, eg: a higher or degree level apprenticeship, higher level technical study or a degree.

• Five GCSEs grade 4 or above including maths, English a a relevant subject or a level 2 qualification in a relevant subject at a merit/distinction and maths and English GCS grade 4 or above

(Dendrobates Tinctorius)
