YOUR STUDY PROGRAMME

Your course will combine:

- Your main qualification.
- Maths and English if you haven't achieved GCSE grade 4 or higher.
- Work experience, related to your course.

You will be assigned a personal tutor, who will monitor your progress and provide guidance for developing your skills in tutorial sessions.

Depending on your chosen subject, a typical college day starts at 8.45am and ends at 4.30pm.

You're not usually required to attend campus 5 days per week, although a certain amount of self-study time is expected to support your learning.



They are career-focused, with 80% of your time in the classroom and the other 20% on a relevant industry placement, getting real onthe-job experience. Move into a skilled occupation or further study, eg: a higher or degree level apprenticeship, higher level technical study or a degree.


