E Level entitlement

If you are aged 19-23 and you do not already have a full level 3 qualification (or above), your course will be fully funded. Your course will also be funded if you meet the unemployed or low-income criteria listed below; but only if you are aged 19 – 23.

U Unemployment or low income

This course will be fully funded if you meet one of the following criteria:

- Employed with a sole income of less than £25,000 or,
- Unemployed and claiming an incomebased benefit or,
- Unemployed and not claiming any benefits.

If you do not meet the above criteria and the course you are studying is level 2 or below, you may be entitled to a discounted fee if your household income is less than £50,000 per annum through our financial support scheme.

Please note that there are no fee waivers or reductions available for our short, learning for leisure courses.

L Advanced Learner Loan

This course is eligible for the Advanced Learner Loan (ALL), which will cover the full cost of the course and you do not start repayment until you are earning over £25,000 per year.

Financial Support

If you are aged 19 or over when you start your course and your household income is below £50,000 per annum (yours and your co-habiting partner's if applicable), you are likely to be eligible for either our Discretionary Learner Support Fund or Advanced Learner Loan Bursary.

If eligible, you could receive a contribution towards:

- • courses fees, if applicable
- transport a contribution is allocated based on mileage and is paid at the end of each month (based on your attendance)
- • uniform, kit and equipment
- • compulsory trips
- accommodation if you are studying Access to Medicine or Access to Veterinary Science and live over 2.5 hours away and relocate to the area
- childcare costs for the hours you are in college (for those aged 20 or above. If you are 19, please see gov.uk/care-to-learn).

Please note that learners who pay the full course fee for a level 3 or level 4 course are not eligible for either bursary.

Concerned about returning to learning as an adult?

I'm concerned about course fees and travel/childcare costs.

If you are aged 19+ and unemployed, on a low wage or claiming a state benefit, you might be able to study for free! You may also be eligible for our financial support scheme if your household income is less than £50,000pa (check our website for current allowance). Speak to us or check out our online fee calculator.

I didn't pass my English/Maths GCSE (or equivalent) at school.

We can help! We will assess your ability in English/Maths and place you on the right course for you, from Functional Skills to GCSE. You can often study these alongside another course.

English isn't my first language.

We offer full and part-time ESOL (English for Speakers of Other Languages) courses which will help you develop your skills in speaking, listening, reading and writing.

Access to Higher Education (Level 3)

Our Access to Higher Education qualifications are a great stepping stone into higher education or your dream career.

If you're aged 19 – 23, you will be eligible to study an access course for free if you meet one of the following criteria:

- Studying your first (Level 3) (or higher) qualification or,
- Employed with a sole income of less than £25,000 or,
- Unemployed and claiming an income-based benefit or,
- Unemployed and not claiming any benefits.

If you do not meet the above criteria or you are aged 24 or above, you can apply for an Advanced Learner Loan (ALL), which will cover the full cost of the course. You don't start repaying your loan until you earn over £25,000 per year and, as an exclusive benefit for Access to Higher Education courses only, your ALL will be abolished (i.e. you don't have to pay it back) if you progress onto and complete a degree!
