

CSCS OPERATIVE LEVEL HEALTH, SAFETY & ENVIRONMENT TEST

PERSONAL BELONGINGS

Lockers are available for candidate use.

Candidates are kindly advised that they may be required to demonstrate on entry to the test room that they have no concealed personal belongings, e.g. pockets, sleeves etc.

The following are examples of items **NOT** allowed (but not limited to) inside the test room:

Outerwear (coats or jackets)	<p>No coats can be worn in the test room.</p> <p>Clothing that is part of an outfit that would typically be worn indoors (including sweaters, sweatshirts and blazers / suit coats, or any other layered clothing that is part of an outfit) is allowed.</p> <p>Candidates are permitted to carry a sweater or sweatshirt into the test room with them and are permitted to take it off and place it on the back of their chair if it gets too warm.</p>
Hats, hairbands, etc.	<p>No hats of any kind or other head coverings are allowed inside the test room (this does not apply to religious / cultural apparel). Small hairbands and clips are permitted.</p>
Mobile phones or pagers	<p>Candidates should turn off the sound on their mobile phones and pagers before placing them in the locker.</p>
Purses, wallets and watches	<p>Watches should be stored inside the lockers. Discreet jewellery (e.g. rings) are permitted.</p>
Computers, personal digital assistants (PDAs), iPods or other electronic devices	<p>Please ensure all electronic devices are turned off and placed inside the lockers.</p>
Briefcases, backpacks or bags	
Notes, notebooks, study guides	
Calculators	
Dictionaries, including language translation dictionaries	
Pens and pencils belonging to the candidate	
Water bottles, contact lens solution, eye drops and lip balm	<p>Cough drops and pills are allowed as long as they are unwrapped and not in a bottle or other container. Inhalers are allowed inside the test room.</p>
Food, drinks or tobacco products	<p>Candidates are NOT permitted to bring food or beverages into the test room, but they may store the items in a locker.</p>
Comfort aids	<p>Candidates may not bring in their own tissues – these will be provided by the Test Administrator.</p> <p>Certain comfort aids (e.g. bandages, slings etc.) may be allowed inside the test room but could be subject to reporting via an Incident Report.</p>
